In over **40** violent conflicts around the world, the **Centre for Humanitarian Dialogue (known as HD)** brings parties to the table to build a common vision for a better future. HD negotiates healthcare access in hard-to-reach conflict areas, educates and trains local mediators, and facilitates consensus-building on environmentally sustainable pathways forward.

With the support of our donors, HD helps societies address their conflicts so children can return to school, health clinics can reopen, and economies rebound.

HD is active across Asia: Myanmar, Thailand, the Philippines, South China Sea, and Bay of Bengal. HD has an extensive network of dedicated experts and local partners throughout Asia.

- In the Southern Philippines, a region plagued by conflict, HD is supporting a sustainable transition to peace. HD has trained hundreds of local leaders rooted within communities to mediate peaceful ends to violent disputes.
- In the South China Sea, HD brings together coastguards of the region to reduce tensions, and regional scientists to prevent a collapse in fish stocks that could undermine food security, livelihoods, and destabilise Asia.
- During the conflict in the Indonesian province of Aceh, HD mediated a landmark ceasefire enabling the delivery of essential humanitarian aid. This ceasefire was the first step in a negotiation that eventually ended the conflict, allowing Aceh to live in peace and rebuild its economy.



## **HD Asia Peace Fund**


**Asia is at a crossroads.** The looming threats of extremism, rising inequality, and increased polarisation among communities, could impede its remarkable progress.
